The Arts:

This year Camp Wildcat will be offering an arts program that runs for the length of the summer. Campers will have the opportunity to attend music, art, and theatre classes each week. Certified teachers will teach these classes.

On **Wednesday, August 2nd** we will host a Parent Performance where campers will display their art pieces, show off their musical talents, and perform theatrical pieces they have worked on collectively and as individuals.

Field Trips:

Rising first-grade campers and above will attend 15 off-campus field trips. This total includes a weekly trip to the Salvation Army Kroc Aquatic Center. The Center has a large pool and water slide. Campers will go to the Aquatic Center on Tuesday mornings. Other field trips include but are not limited to Incredible Pizza, Cedar Hill Farms, and the Memphis Zoo. Transportation to and from field trips will be provided by ABC Charter Bus Company. Additionally, Camp Wildcat will have 10 on-campus activities throughout the summer. These activities include two water slides, Seize the Clay, and an ice cream truck every other Friday. The dates listed on the calendar have been booked and are reserved for Camp Wildcat.

Choice Activities:

During most weeks, campers will have five opportunities to choose the activity that interests them the most. For example, on the schedule for the first week of camp 11:30 until 12:30 is blocked off for either “Building Robots or Canvas Shoe Decorating.” One activity is more analytical and fosters an interest in robotics. The other is for those with an interest in art. Campers will be given an introduction to both activities and will be allowed to choose according to their interests.



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The Amazing Race:

This year, instead of weekly themes, we have decided to hold an all-encompassing theme. Camp Wildcat will host an Amazing Race where campers will split into teams and engage in friendly competitions. Each week the camp will host a new country. Using a map, campers will race to cities located around campus where the competitions are being held. While racing, campers will learn interesting facts about the country and use that knowledge to gain bonus points at the end of the week. In addition, campers will sample unique foods, learn phrases in foreign languages, and listen to music associated with the countries they visit.

For example, Australia is the first of a 10-leg race. Campers will open envelopes containing competition cards such as “Using the basket supplied to you, collect all 22 million people included in Australia’s population on the way to the capital. Go to the capital, Canberra, when your team has completed the task.” The team with this competition card will have to collect 22 of the paper cutouts that the staff has hidden on the path to the capital. Each cutout represents 1 million people.

Pricing

The total cost per week is \$220. A week is considered to be four to five camp days.

Drop-In With Activity On or Off Campus: \$60

Drop-In Without Outside Activity: \$45

If you pay for the entire summer in full you will receive a **\$20 discount per week** for the entire summer. This discount only applies to a full week of camp and cannot be used for drop-in days.

Sign Up before **March 1st** and receive a **\$10 discount per week** for the entire summer. This discount cannot be used with any other discounts.
