

Camp Wildcat 2017

Pre-K and Rising Kindergarten

The Arts:

This year we will be offering an arts program that runs for the length of the summer. Campers will have the opportunity to attend music, art, and theatre classes each week. Certified teachers will teach these classes.

On **Wednesday, August 2nd** we will host a Parent Performance where campers will display their art pieces, show off their musical talents, and perform theatrical pieces they have worked on collectively.

Field Trips:

Preschoolers and Rising Kindergarteners will attend four off-campus field trips. This total includes a trip to the Children's Museum, Cedar Hill Farms, the Memphis Zoo, and Kid's Play. ICCS staff will provide transportation to and from the field trip locations. Additionally, Camp Wildcat will have 10 on-campus activities throughout the summer. These activities include two water slides, Seize the Clay, and an ice cream truck every other Friday. The dates listed on the calendar have been booked and are reserved for Camp Wildcat.

Activities:

Each week Preschoolers and Rising Kindergarteners will focus on an author and his or her collection of children's books. Their activities will stem from the book chosen for that day. For example, the first week's author is Eric Carle. A book from his collection has been chosen for each day of the week. The first day's book is *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. After reading the book together, campers will start with an activity outside where they find food mentioned in the book and feed it to the life-sized caterpillar the team has created for them. In the afternoon, campers continue with the same theme by rotating in stations, which include making their own hungry caterpillar and reenacting the book.

Campers will also be provided with one water day per week. Two hours will be set aside for water activities. Activities will typically include the use of small swimming pools, sprinklers, and water toys. However, a water slide will be provided during two of the ten weeks.



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Additionally, each Friday the campers will be introduced to new age-appropriate board games. Part of the state standards show that preschoolers should be learning how to engage in competition with one another through things like board games. Games such as “Feed the Woozle” and “Hi-HO Cherry O” will be provided.

Nap:

Nap will be offered for two hours each day. Children who do not want to sleep may read a book on their mats for the first hour. After the first hour is up, campers may choose to color, read, or put together a puzzle in a separate area. Those who do sleep for the entire naptime will be awakened after two hours. Mats will be provided.

Pricing

The total cost per week is \$220. A week is considered to be four to five camp days.

Drop-In With Activity On or Off Campus: \$60

Drop-In Without Outside Activity: \$45

If you pay for the entire summer in full, you will receive a **\$20 discount per week** for the entire summer. This discount only applies to a full week of camp and cannot be used for drop-in days.

Sign Up before **March 1st** and receive a **\$10 discount per week** for the entire summer. This discount cannot be used with any other discounts.

Sibling rates are as follows:

Two Children: \$390 weekly total

Three Children: \$540 weekly total

Four Children: \$670 weekly total
